

Dear Applicant,

We appreciate your interest in the child life practicum here at Children's Health. This packet is designed to provide you with an overview of the child life department, practicum requirements and answer your questions. We hope that this packet not only answers your questions but provides you with enough information to decide whether our program would be a good fit for your learning style as a student. Please note that we are also looking to find the best fit and student for our program size and structure as well. To find the actual application and access required documents, you must visit the Children's website at www.childrens.com and search "child life practicum."

About the Child Life Department

- Oldest Child Life program in Texas and celebrated 50 years in 2024
- Among the largest Child Life programs in the country (66 full time CLS at Dallas)
- The child life department includes child life specialists, child life assistants, music therapists, a technology specialist, a special events/arts program coordinator, adaptive care program, and facility dogs
- There are 6 playrooms hospital wide and a therapeutic arts room at Dallas
- There is pet therapy weekly in addition to the in-house facility dogs
- The child life department helps support programming and special visitors through the Red Balloon Network, which is an in-house radio/broadcasting station

Overview of the Practicum/Pre-internship

- We offer fall, spring, and summer practicums
- Rotations will be at the Dallas campus.
- The practicum is 240 hours, 15 weeks long, 2 days a week, with 2 main rotation placements that are each six weeks long
- The practicum students get to choose the two, consistent days to come during the 15 weeks (students choose from Tuesday, Wednesday, and Thursday)
- The practicum is observational in nature however there the hands-on opportunities for learning include planning and implementing therapeutic activities in the playroom/bedside and introducing services and building rapport with patients/families, when appropriate
- The practicum consists of active learning student group sessions as well as readings and weekly assignments, therapeutic activities, and journals to complete
- Large assignments include individual stress potential, census stress potential, evidence-based practice (EBP) article reviews and portfolio presentation

Application Requirements

Note-there is no application fee to apply to our program. There is also no fee charged to students who are accepted to complete our practicum program.

Note-Our program uses the Southern Association of Child Life Professionals (SACLP) Common Application, Reference Form and Course in Progress Form

- The application and detailed requirements are on www.childrens.com and then search "Child life practicum"
- Application deadlines are: January 3, March 24, September 5
- Applicants must be affiliated with a university both at the time of applying and throughout the
 internship. Note- at this time, we cannot enter any new affiliations. See the link on our website
 of schools we currently have affiliation
- Applicants must have experience in working with children at the time of applying. **Note**-this experience can be virtual or in person and can include volunteer and/or paid experiences.
- A minimum of a 3.0 GPA in the major is required
- Two recommendation forms, using the forms on the website must be submitted: one academic and one someone who has directly observed your work with children
- Unofficial transcripts from all Universities attended must be included. Official transcripts will be required to be submitted if the student is accepted into our internship program
- Applicants must have completed at least 15 hours of related course work
 - Applicants must now list 3 of the 5 required courses on the application as the courses listed in the table below
 - The table below shows the courses the Association of Child Life Professionals (ACLP) will require beginning January 1, 2019 in order for candidates to sit for the child life certification examination. These requirements go into effect for those taking the certification examination after January 1, 2019. Please view the "2019 eligibility details" document on the ACLP website for more detailed information on this.
 - Please note, the 3 required courses can be in progress at the time of the practicum application, but must be completed by the start of the practicum experience.
 - If the courses are in progress at the time of the application, candidates must submit the SACLP course in Progress Form as listed on the application website.

Application Deadlines:

Children's Health follows the recommend application deadlines and offer dates as agreed upon by other hospitals in the state of Texas, as listed below:

Your application will not be reviewed if:

- It is incomplete
- It is received later than the required deadline date as listed below
- You fail to meet one of the requirements as listed above (affiliation, GPA minimum, experience with children and/or incomplete coursework)
- The applicant is not and will not be affiliated with a university on the list on our website that we currently have an affiliation.
- Additional items are included other than what is required for the application
- **Please do not put photos on your resumes or documents**

Application Review:

- Applications are initially reviewed by the Education Coordinator to ensure they are complete and meet the requirements
- Applications that meet the requirements are then reviewed by members of the practicum committee, using a screening and scoring rubric
- Applicants that move forward in the process will be contacted by a member of the practicum committee via e-mail to schedule a short phone screen, and then evaluated using a screening and scoring rubric
- The practicum committee and Education Coordinator will then select up to 10 applicants to participate in the formal interview process.
- Following the interviews, offers will be made using the offer dates and process as listed in the chart above
- Applicants who do not receive an offer can contact the Education Coordinator to request feedback

Interview Process: multi-mini interviews (MMI)

- Children's Health uses a MMI interviewing format
- Interviews will be held one to two weeks prior to the offer date. The dates are placed on the website each January for the entire year, so candidates have ample time to ensure they are free on the date, if selected.
- Candidates will be contacted with one date in which all interviews will take place
- All interviews will be conducted virtually.
- Candidates will choose an afternoon or morning time slot on the given day
- Up to 5 candidates will come and be interviewed during each time slot
- The candidates will move through different virtual rooms and participate in short, timed interview sessions with members of the intern committee. Each interview group will end with a virtual tour and overview of the program by the Education Coordinator, followed by a Q&A session.
- The interview is a behavioral interview format where questions will be asked around child development/theory, the candidates experience with children in various settings as well as the candidates experience with working with a team, problem solving, etc.
- A more detailed email will be sent to the candidates prior to the interview date, detailing instructions of where to go and with more details on the flow of the interview session
- Candidates will be scored based on a scoring rubric and the top candidates will be given an
 offer

Frequently Asked Questions:

- Can I still apply for a practicum/pre-internship if I already have a degree? Yes, but you must be affiliated (and ability to enroll) with a university
- I will graduate before the practicum/ pre-internship starts, so I will not be affiliated with a university. Is this okay? No, all candidates must be affiliated
- I want to do my practicum or pre-internship experience at Children's; will I still be eligible for an internship at Children's? No. At this time, students can complete either a practicum/pre-internship experience or an internship at Children's, not both.
- I am interested in gaining more volunteer experience, what can I do? We recommend volunteering at camps, day care centers, children's hospitals, babysitting, etc.
- I completed a practicum at my university child development center; will this suffice for the child life practicum? No, a practicum must be conducted under the supervision of a Certified Child Life Specialist
