



Laxative Program.

Goal: The goal of giving laxatives is for your child to have 1–2 soft-formed poops every day.

Medicines	Directions
Laxative	
Start with: Senna 15 mg chocolate square square(s) Senna 8.6 mg tablet tablet(s) Senna 15 mg tablet tablet(s) Senna 25 mg tablet tablet(s) Liquid Senna 8.8 mg/5 ml ml	 You do not need a prescription for these medicines. Give the full amount of laxative prescribed 1 time a day. The medicine works best if you give it to your child at the same time each day.
Fiber Start with:	
□ Benefiber teaspoon(s) times/day □ Metamucil teaspoon(s) times/day □ Pectin tablespoon(s) times/day □ Citrucel tablespoon(s) times/day	 Fiber will make your child's poop more formed. Mix powder into a food or a drink your child likes (juice, yogurt, applesauce, chocolate milk, etc.). Make sure your child eats or drinks the entire amount to get the full dose of fiber. Take fiber with a meal.
Enema Only use if no poop in 24 hours □ ½ (half) of pediatric Fleet enema □ 1 full pediatric Fleet enema □ 1 adult Fleet enema □ 1 large volume foley enema	Follow the directions on the package.

What to expect during Bowel Management Week:

Give your child the laxative in the evening. The next morning, before 10 a.m., your child will get an abdominal x-ray. We will call you every day to check how your child is doing. After we look at the x-ray and your daily report, we will tell you if you need to give more or less of the laxative and fiber.





What to do at home:

If your child does not poop within 24 hours after the last laxative dose, **give an enema**. This helps clear out poop from the rectum (the lower part of the bowel where poop is stored). After the enema, **increase the next laxative dose by 1 square or tablet**. <u>Keep using this new dose for all future doses</u>.

If your child starts having frequent loose and watery poop, the laxative dose is too high. Lower the dose by half $(\frac{1}{2})$ a square or tablet. **Keep using this new dose for all future doses**.
