


Keeping children safe in booster seats

Children ages 8-12 years old may still need to ride in a booster seat.




A child is ready for a booster seat when they have outgrown the height and weight limit of their 5-point harness.

Check the manual to see if your child's car seat can be converted to a booster seat.



A booster seat lifts a child so that the seatbelt fits across their chest and low on their hips. **NEVER** use a booster seat with a lap-only seatbelt.



According to Texas law,

ALL CHILDREN YOUNGER THAN

8 YEARS (unless 4'9" or taller)

must ride in a car seat or

booster seat that is height- and

weight-appropriate.

Types of booster seats:





High Back





No Back



Use a **HIGH-BACK BOOSTER SEAT** if your car does not have a headrest.
